### Community Outreach Analysis - February 4, 2010

A team of five USCGA first class (senior) cadets majoring in management have undertaken, for their senior class project, a community outreach analysis for our Rotary Club. The project

involves designing a generic process which the club could apply for reviewing and selecting future projects to meet needs in the community. They also will identify a list of potential projects and rank order them to facilitate the development of a final grant. To gain an understanding of the types of projects that would qualify for a R I matching grant and to learn about projects previously undertaken by our club, the cadets visited with Rotarians on Feb 4th. President Anna Lathrop convened a panel of Rotarians prior to the meeting who met with the cadets to discuss grant guidelines, previous community projects undertaken by our club, and possible areas of future community projects. The team will develop a list of suitable projects, analyze relative costs and benefits of the identified projects, make a recommendation and present this recommendation to the Board of Directors this Spring.
