Rotary Program: Winston Churchill
"Man of the Century"

Winston Churchill (1874-1965) son of Lord Randolph Churchill and Jeanie Jerome,an American had a childhood of wretched



neglect. He graduated last in his class at Harrow and barely made it into Sandhurst, the UK's West Point. From there he went on to become the most celebrated person in the 20th century and the man most credited with saving the world from Hitler and the Nazis. By the age of 23 he had been in four wars and in all he saw action in fifteen battles. Elected to the House of Commons at 26 he remained till 88. No other man occupied more Cabinet Posts including Prime Minister 1940-45 and 1951-55. As an orator he is probably unequaled and his speeches were characterized by adherence to the truth as he saw it, lack of spin, passion and a sense of humor. His quips and his sallies are legendary. A prolific writer he went on to receive the Nobel Prize in Literature. To his credit he became an accomplished painter with 500 finished paintings and several exhibits. His personal life was free of scandal and a 50 year marriage. What a role model for today's leaders.!
